Our thanks go to 2014 Treasure Street Chairmen Rick and Lori Ashmore Peters. This year's event raised more than \$1 million for TSRHC.

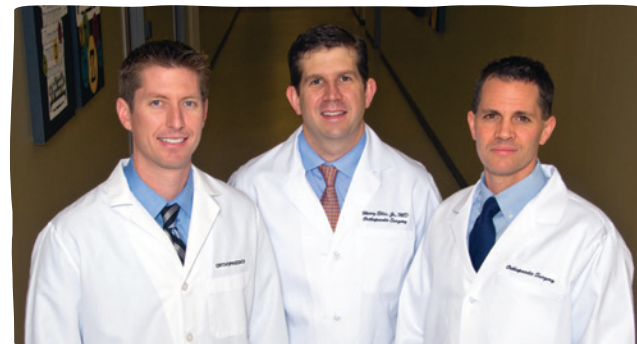

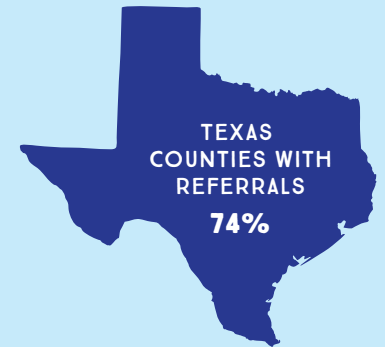
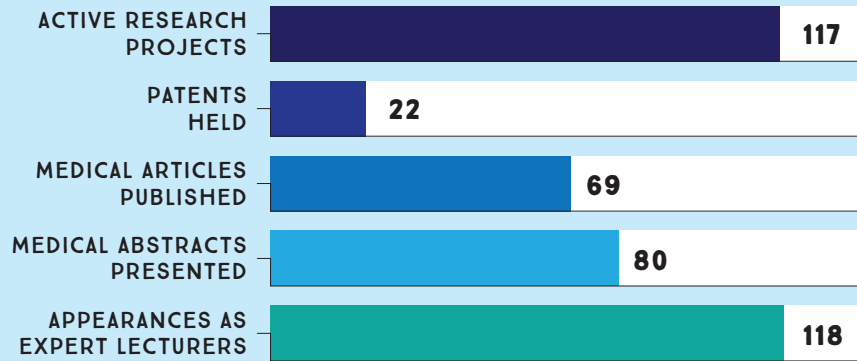

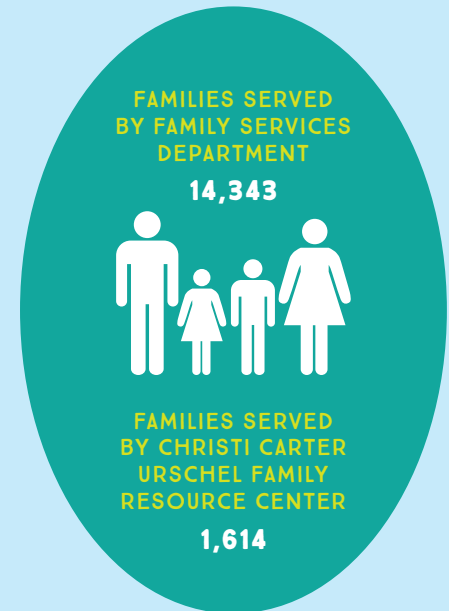

HOME TO WORLD-CLASS CLUBFOOT CARE

At TSRHC, 3-year-old patient Alex feels right at home, running, crawling and climbing. Thanks to the outstanding treatment he received at TSRHC's Center for Excellence in Clubfoot Research, he can do all of those things. The center is at the forefront of practicing less invasive, non-operative treatment methods for clubfoot, a congenital condition that affects boys twice as often as girls. TSRHC conducts extensive research to offer the best treatment options for the condition and a wide variety of other foot disorders.
